billion people globally lack access to electricity and rely on the traditional use of dirty fuels such as kerosene or diesel.

Social implications

- Breathing kerosene fumes is the equivalent of smoking two packets of cigarettes a day. Two thirds of adult females with lung cancer in emerging nations are nonsmokers
- · Flammable fuels are source of fires, cause severe skin & eye irritation, coughing, allergies and skin cancer
- Kerosene is up to 10 times more expensive than using solar lamps for light. More than \$27 billion that could be spent on other things.

Environmental implications

- Kerosene lamps emit almost entirely black carbon (BC) and CO₂, both of which cause global warming
- · Natural habitats are protected from deforestation, as currently wood is collected for cooking
- · Kerosene and diesel dependence lead to toxic waste in living areas and water sources
- · The immediate indoor air environment is a health hazard, due to black-carbon emissions

Economic implications

- Lack of mobile phone charging possibilities gravely hinders communication & commerce
- · Entrepreneurial development and productivity stunted due to lack of proper light sources
- Information vital to development of local business and agriculture cannot be accessed due to lack of power supply for internet access points
- Access to markets outside of the local one is denied the farmers and entrepreneurs

This fact has huge social, economic and environmental implications.
